

## **BAD COFFEE - Drama**

### **Ethical concerns**

1. The subject matter of the film, as in the mental illnesses addressed, may cause physical or mental harm to the film's director;
  - a. Thus, a **'safety plan'** as been put in order that consists of:
    - i. Possessing the telephone number(s) of the closest hospital(s) to each of the locations we will shoot in, throughout the production period;
    - ii. The telephone number of the on-campus medical team and security team at Middlesex University, when we film in the premises;
    - iii. Possessing contacts for emotional distress helplines in case the director or anyone from the cast and/or crew need emergency support;.
    - iv. Contacting the Well-Being counselling team at the university and ensuring, after having explained the director's past struggles with depression and the current undertaking of this film drama, that they dispense a therapist that would be on-site during part of the filming period to assist not only the director but anyone in the cast and crew that might need support.
    - v. And lastly, I will possess the mobile phone number of one of her close friends, who is also the film's editor, that might offer some further emotional support, if the situation requires it.
